In today's new reality of the coronavirus pandemic, the only WIZO Day Care Centres operating are those on hospital sites. The children who generally attend these Day Care Centres are from the vicinity, together with the children of key hospital workers.

However, currently, WIZO is answering the call to provide supervised day care for the children of the doctors, nurses and other medical personnel, and has mobilised its care entirely towards these children. Their parents, who are on the front line of the battle against coronavirus, have one less worry, knowing their children are taken care of while they are working, enabling them to focus all their efforts on their patients.

"In normal times, if there was no day care, I would leave my kids with their grandmother, but now I can't," said Anat, a nurse at the hospital. "It's heartbreaking really," she says, "my mom is so disappointed that she can't help me. She desperately wants to see her grandkids, but is in isolation because her age makes her vulnerable to infection. I have a hard time explaining to her that it is for her own good. I worry about her."

"Here, I know my kids are being taken care of, entertained and educated. They get a good meal and are completely safe. One less thing to worry about!" Anat said. "It is reassuring that the Day Care Centre staff take our temperature before we are can leave our kids. I welcome these health checks obviously, and I can start my working day feeling positive. Simply put, without the WIZO Day Care Centre I just would not be able to work. I cannot leave them with my neighbours, or even my sister who lives close by. Social isolation is not something to be ignored. I am a nurse, every one of us is needed. How can I not work? I am so grateful to WIZO."

Anat's children, aged 4 and 6, attend a local nursery and school, which are both closed at the moment.

Three outstanding young women were awarded scholarships in memory of Michal, Yitzhak and Harela Modai. Michal Modai, who served as the fourth president of World WIZO from 1996-2004, set up a scholarship fund in memory of her husband Yitzchak, an influential Israeli politician, and in memory of their daughter Harela who was killed in a traffic accident. Among her many accomplishments, she established the first of WIZO's shelters for women who are victims of domestic abuse.



The three Modai Scholarship recipients were: Yasmin Avrani - a 15-year-old graduate of WIZO's Otzma Tzeira (Young Strength) programme which empowers teenage girls through the arts. Her scholarship will go towards studies at the music conservatory in her hometown of Ashkelon.



Eden Ben-Shitrit - Eden spent 11 years living in Neve WIZO which is a foster family community consisting of 5 houses. Run by foster parents, each Neve WIZO house is home to 8 children from the ages of 3 to 18, who were removed from their families due to their parents' inability to raise them. Eden is now an independent 26-year-old woman living on her own studying biology at Bar-Ilan University. The Modai Scholarship will help Eden finance her university studies.



Tal Ofri - A 21-year-old graduate of the Hadassim Youth Village, Tal was born and raised in New York. Tal made aliyah with her family when she was 10, but due to family problems, she found herself living and studying at Hadassim, which in her words "became my real home" from the age of 13-18. Now Tal is a first year BA student in Business Administration at the College of Management. The Modai Scholarship will help her finance her studies. Speaking on behalf of the three scholarship awardees, Tal said, "Without everything WIZO did for us, we would not be where we are today".

The EGM audience was treated to a special surprise as WIZO's founder, Rebecca Sieff, suddenly appeared and addressed the audience as if she had journeyed 100 years into the future from 1920 to today. Actress Natalie Blenford portrayed Rebecca Sieff. A spotlight was shown on Sderot, where residents live under constant threat of rocket attacks. Following a video showing WIZO in Sderot, the Mayor of Sderot, Alon Davidi, delivered an emotional address of thanks.





Daniel Birnbaum, Chairman of the remarkable SodaStream, was interviewed by Emily Frances of i24 News and delivered an inspiring fireside chat. "Here's the first key to our success at SodaStream, and I am sure this applies to WIZO as well. It's about people - empowering the people," Birnbaum explained. He went on to share that 2,500 people of all religions and backgrounds work at the SodaStream factory in southern Israel. "Come and visit," Birnbaum said, "you will see what peace looks like. I tell the workers that in these buildings you manufacture peace every day!"

Lifting their voices in song, WIZO chaverot from around the word joined together to sing the iconic Israeli song 'Hallelujah' in three languages!

Professor Dan Ariely, (below) Professor of Psychology and Behavioural Economics at Duke University, who in 2018 was named one of the 50 most influential living psychologists in the world, delivered a captivating talk about how can we help ourselves live up to our potential and behave better.



A series of TED-style talks hosted by the founder of Future Formats, Maya Elhalal, featured cofounder of Virtuozo Abigail Tenembaum, Neve WIZO graduate Eden Ben-Shitrit, and Major A, a female combat navigator, Squadron 210, Israeli Air Force. "WIZO flows through my veins," said Abigail. "My grandmother was active in WIZO in Argentina starting in 1926. Her life revolved around WIZO."

Moderator Rolene Marks, Head of Public Diplomacy and Hasbara at World WIZO, hosted a thought-provoking panel featuring three distinguished guests: Michael Dickson (left) - Executive Director of Stand With Us Israel, Paul Hirschson (centre) - Former Israeli Ambassador to West Africa and Frank Melloul (right) - Founder and CEO of the international News Channel i24 News. "After this session we feel a lot more motivated," Rolene said in her closing remarks. "We are not just a sisterhood, we are an army! We women can be warriors for Israel and the Jewish people!"



Another highlight of the EGM was welcoming the newly elected members of World WIZO's executive committee, including re-elected World WIZO President Esther Mor and newly elected World WIZO Chairperson Anita Friedman.

The last event on the EGM schedule was a grand closing celebration featuring a delicious dinner followed by performances by students from WIZO youth villages. World famous mentalist Lior Suchard served as the host, delighting the crowd with his amazing mind reading abilities.



He was followed by one of Israel's most popular performers Einat Sarouf, who had the entire audience on their feet singing and dancing to classic Israeli songs. It was a fantastic way to kick off World WIZO's centennial year.

disabled, and services to prevent and treat high-risk students.

The school's rededication ceremony was held in the presence of Mayor Moshe Leon, World WIZO President Esther Mor, World WIZO outgoing Chairperson Professor Rivka Lazovsky and incoming Chairperson Anita Friedman. WIZOUK presented the Jerusalem Mayor with a painting. Kobi Hillel, CEO of WIZO Beit Hakerem, said: "A few years ago, I dared to dream of a study house that will honour the extraordinary educational activities that take place at our school. I did not believe that only a few years later WIZO would fulfil my dream.
